Individual researchers have been or are being funded at **Case Western Reserve University, The Cleveland Clinic, University Hospitals of Cleveland, MetroHealth Medical Center in Cleveland, The Ohio State University, Nationwide Children's Hospital, University of Toledo, Bowling Green State University, Cincinnati Children's Hospital Medical Center, University of Cincinnati, University of Dayton, Ohio University, Wright State University** and the former Hipple Cancer Research Center in Dayton.

Over \$18 million has been spent on cancer awareness and seed money research projects. Of that amount, **over \$7 million in seed money** provided to researchers by Ohio Cancer Research has generated **over \$240 million in new money** from other sources to continue basic cancer research on projects initially funded as well as translational clinical trials at institutions including University Hospitals Seidman Cancer Center, The Cleveland Clinic, The Ohio State University, and Cincinnati Children's Hospital Medical Center.
